Dear Mr. Robson:

The IMS Global Learning Consortium ("IMS") hereby grants permission to the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc. ("IEEE"), to modify and reprint material found in the documents that make up the IMS Reusable Definition of Competency or Educational Objective Specification Version 1.0 published on October 25, 2002 (the "Submission"). This permission is granted for consideration as a potential IEEE standard or to serve as the base document for standard development, in accordance with Section 5.2 of the IEEE Standards Style Manual. Permission is granted for world rights and applies to all future revisions and editions in all media known or hereinafter known. IMS retains full rights to modify and distribute its original document.

The foregoing permissions are conditional upon your acceptance of the following conditions:

1. IEEE will adopt a modified name from that of the initial submission, if the submission becomes the basis for an IEEE standard, in order to avoid any confusion in the marketplace.

2.

(a) All modifications made during the process of preparing the submission for approval by the IEEE balloting group will be dealt with by a mutually agreeable process.

(b) If the submission, with such modifications as approved the ballot group, is used as the basis for a standard adopted by IEEE, then in the course of maintaining an approved IEEE standard, the IEEE will communicate the purpose of any desired Modification (and any other information that is deemed to be relevant) to IMS in writing, and IMS will inform IEEE in writing within thirty days whether or not it desires to take responsibility for creating the Modification to the standard in its then-current form. IMS will give the same priority to such a project as it gives to all other then-current technical processes. Upon completion, it will submit the Modifications to IEEE in the same manner, and with the same permissions, as are set forth in this letter agreement.


(c) If IMS declines to undertake the work requested, or if IEEE rejects the Modifications submitted by IMS, IEEE will be entitled to undertake the project through its own process.

3. Credit Line Required: "This standard is based on the IMS Reusable Definition of Competency or Educational Objective Specification Version 1.0 published on October 25, 2002." [To be updated as necessary in the future.] Placement Required: In front matter

4. The aforementioned permission shall be granted to the IEEE on a royalty-free basis, and the IEEE shall be the sole copyright owner to the derivative work represented by the final document approved by IEEE.
